Core Requirement 2.3

The institution has a chief executive officer whose primary responsibility is to the institution and who is not the presiding officer of the board.

Impact Statement

The Chief Executive Officer of Baton Rouge Community College (BRCC), who has provided leadership and managerial direction throughout the substantive change, continues in her role as the CEO for the merged College.

Rationale

The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) for Baton Rouge Community College is the Chancellor, Dr. Andrea Lewis Miller. Dr. Miller has served as BRCC's CEO since February 2012 and has provided leadership to ensure the college achieves its vision and mission, and adheres to its values, while emphasizing fiscal stability, enrollment growth, fundraising, workforce development, legislative efforts, business relationships, and image building. She has overseen the merger of Capital Area Technical College with Baton Rouge Community College that has led the College's ongoing strategic planning efforts, resulting in a major expansion of BRCC's program offerings and facilities.

As stipulated in the LCTCS Bylaws (*Figure 2.2.5*), Chancellor Miller is responsible to the Board of Supervisors, through its President, for the effective execution of all state laws, resolutions, policies, rules and regulations adopted by the Board for the administration and operation of the system, and the governance of all its campuses. Chancellor Miller administers the College and exercises complete executive authority, subject to the direction and control of the President and the Board.
