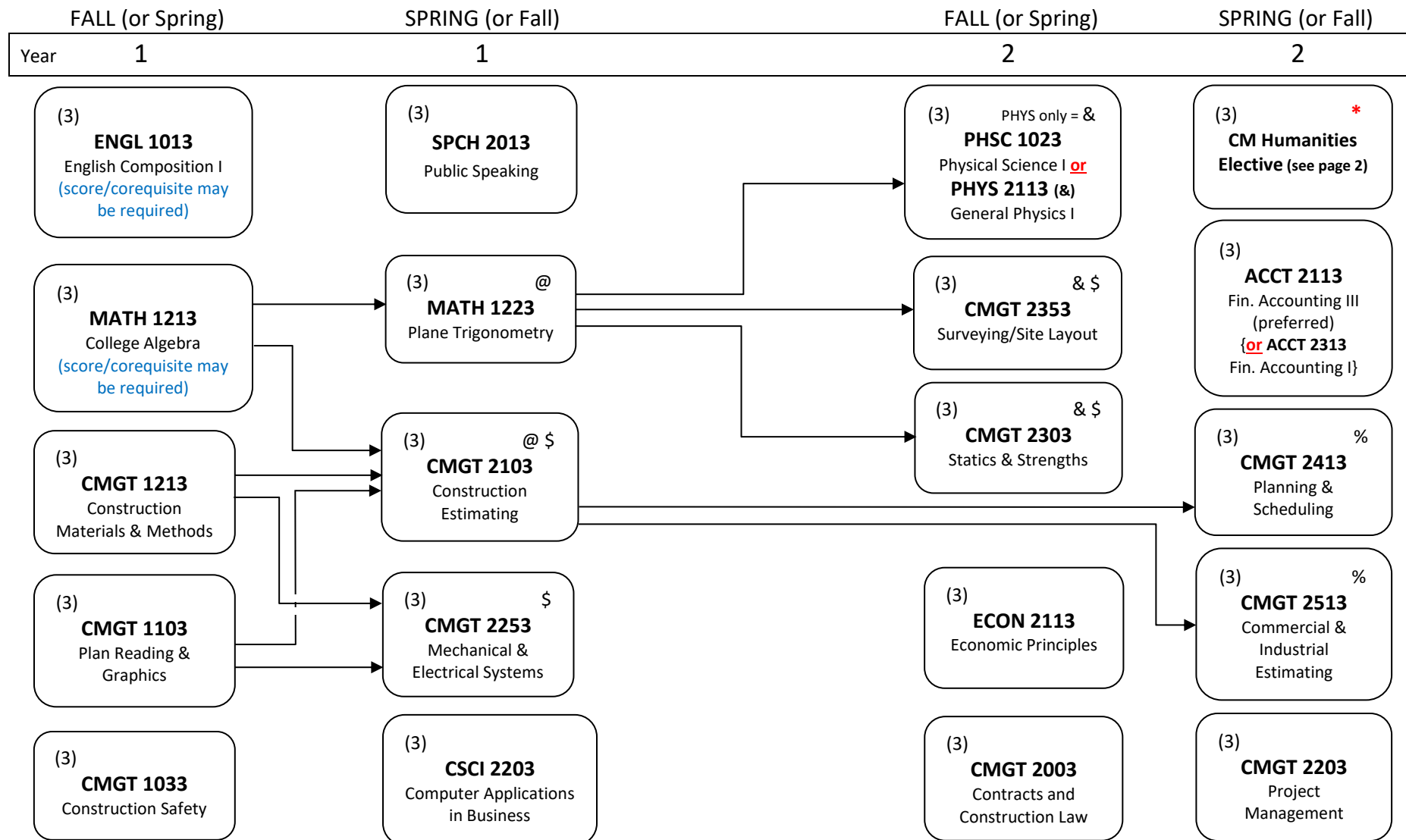


CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT AAS Degree – Course Flowchart
