Group Advisement and Information sessions last approximately 90 minutes and are scheduled several times each semester, including one evening session. You will receive the latest information about prerequisites and sonography as a profession, and have an opportunity to ask questions. The **Group Advisement Information Session** schedule is available online on the **Sonography Program Information** page. Registration is not required and you may invite a guest to attend with you. Meetings are held in ZOOM – click on the link of your choice.

The application packet for admission to the Sonography Program will be available online on the **Sonography Program Information** page **once per year during the fall semester.** Detailed instructions and the timeline for completing the application, submitting transcripts and scheduling the entrance test will be included in the application packet.

COMPLETING THE PREREQUISITES DOES NOT GUARANTEE ADMISSION TO THE SONOGRAPHY PROGRAM. The program includes a three-semester Clinical Practicum at area hospitals and clinics. The number of students admitted to the program is determined by the number of clinical sites. A selective process is used to determine which students are admitted. The process is based on the student's GPA in the 30 hours of prerequisites, score on the entrance exam and numeric score in the prerequisite SONO 1011.

The Sonography program starts every spring semester in January. The program is four semesters or approximately 17 months from the time you are officially admitted to the program. Student selection is made in December after fall semester grades are posted; therefore, **you may apply for the DMS program in the fall semester if you have, or will have, completed all the prerequisites by the end of the fall semester**. You will not be admitted to the program if all prerequisites are not completed by the end of the fall semester in which you make application.

You are invited to seek advisement to develop an academic plan for completion of the prerequisites. Email Mr. Richard Goldsmith at goldsmithr@mybrcc.edu with an explanation of what you need. Include your BRCC ID number and a phone number. Attach an unofficial transcript of any courses taken at another college which you will offer for completion of the prerequisites. Attach the transcript to your email as a PDF or WORD document. DO NOT embed it in the email, DO NOT screen capture or cell phone photo it. It MUST be an attachment. You may request the issuing school to send it as an eScript to goldsmithr@mybrcc.edu. This is for advising ONLY – you must still submit an Official transcript to the BRCC Registrar to transfer the credits to your BRCC records.

1. Admission to the Diagnostic Medical Sonography program is competitive.

2. Applicants must have a GPA of 2.75 or higher & a grade of "C" or higher in the required hours of prerequisite courses below (this may not be the same as your overall GPA):

- 3. A minimum score of 65 on the entrance exam (ATI TEAS) is required to be considered for admission.
- 4. All applicants chosen for admission to the Sonography program must submit to, pay for and satisfactorily complete the following items. Applicants chosen for admission will receive an information packet with vendors in the Baton Rouge area where all of the requirements can be met. This is done ONLY if you are chosen for admission to the Sonography Curriculum.
 - a. Criminal background check, healthcare exclusion list check and fingerprinting.
 - b. 10 panel drug screen.
 - c. Physical exam and check of immunity to a list of communicable diseases.
 - d. Covid vaccination and booster no exceptions are granted.
 - e. CPR certification.
 - f. Purchase of student liability insurance.
 - g. Purchase of uniform (black scrubs).

- 5. **AN ADMISSION SCORE** is calculated for all applicants according to the following formula. The students with the highest scores are invited into the program. Scores are calculated to three decimal places (ie: xx.XXX). GPA = 60 % (in prerequisite courses only) TEAS = 30 %, SONO 1011 Numeric Score = 10%.

 The GPA is the largest component of the admission score, but the ATI TEAS exam is extremely important. It is strongly recommended that students acquire study materials and prepare for the TEAS exam.
- 6. **BIOLOGY:** You must complete Anatomy and Physiology I & II lecture and lab (4 credits). **Prerequisite for BIOL 2213 & 2211 is** BIOL 1033 (Biology I for Science Majors) with C or better OR ACT Composite or Super Composite score of 22 or higher; and eligibility for college algebra.
 - 7. **FINANCIAL AID & SCHOLARSHIPS:** The Sonography program qualifies as full time for purposes of qualifying for TOPS and Federally Guaranteed Student Loans (Financial Aid). However, F.A. reimbursement amount is determined by credit hour load. In order to receive the maximum F.A. you must schedule at least 12 credit hours per semester. If you need to receive the maximum Financial Aid, consider scheduling other electives to reach 12 credit hours.

Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI) – TEST OF ESSENTIAL ACADEMIC SKILLS (TEAS)

Baton Rouge Community College Diagnostic Medical Sonography requires the ATI TEAS entrance test for all qualified applicants to the Sonography program. The ATI TEAS exam comprises 30% of the applicant's admission score.

The test is taken **ONCE ONLY** during the fall application period either at the BRCC Testing Center in Magnolia Building OR from home on computer with an online proctor. When you schedule your choice from posted available days and times you will be required pay the exam fee via credit or debit card. Dates and times available for TEAS testing will be published with the application information on the Sonography page of the BRCC website.

You may purchase a study manual and practice exam from ATI Testing, Inc. at the web links posted below. It is strongly recommended that applicants utilize these study aids to prepare. The practice exams are administered by ATI online. The exam taken during the application period is an online exam.

Louisiana Transfer Associate Degree

The Louisiana Transfer Associate Degree is a two-year portable academic credential that awards junior standing in any Louisiana public university. Advising and planning are key to your success. It is your responsibility to choose the courses that will best prepare you for a specific college and major, and to complete your baccalaureate in a timely manner. BRCC is retake-and-replace

You may retake a class for which you wish to make a better grade.

The latest grade is the grade of record, whether it is a better grade or worse.

Be aware, however, that scheduling the same class more than twice may incur some financial aid restrictions. Ask a financial aid counselor if you are uncertain about the rules which apply.

Pre-Application: Criminal Issues (from ARDMS website)

If you have legal issues on your record, you may not be allowed to work in certain health care settings (hospitals, clinics) or you may not be allowed to challenge the ARDMS registry exams.

If you are presently charged with, or have been convicted or found guilty of or plead *nolo contendere* to any crime (felony and/or misdemeanor), other than a speeding or parking violation, you may have questions concerning this rule and may wish to obtain clarification as to how it pertains to your circumstances. ARDMS conducts a "pre-application review", for a \$125 non-refundable fee, for individuals who wish to determine the impact of a previous criminal matter on their eligibility to apply for ARDMS certification. The pre-application review process is recommended for individuals who have not yet applied for examination and are contemplating employment in the field of sonography and/or enrollment in a sonography program.

DIAGNOSTIC MEDICAL ULTRASOUND is a noninvasive imaging technology such as an OB scan, employed in a radiology department or imaging clinic and is used to examine soft tissue and blood flow.



Noninvasive means that nothing is inserted into the body through the skin (no puncture) and uses no medicines. Additionally, no radiation is employed, unlike X-ray and CT imaging. A water washable gel is applied to the body and a probe is placed on the skin and moved around to view the baby. A similar technique is used to image the other body parts.

Soft tissue includes most of the soft organs of the head, neck, torso and extremities, excluding hard organs like bone and skull. OB imaging examines the developing baby and provides images and measurements your doctor will use to determine the health of your pregnancy, baby's developmental age, weight and delivery date. Ultrasound is also used to examine the Uterus and Ovaries, Abdomen and Gallbladder, Heart and Blood Vessels and other organs.

Sonographers work in hospital Radiology Departments, outpatient Imaging Centers and physicians' offices. Some sonographers with experience and expertise in multiple specialties operate independent scanning services.

BRCC's Diagnostic Medical Sonography program requires 29 hours of prerequisites in General Education: Math, Biology, Physics, English, Psychology, Medical Terminology, Medical Ethics, and Humanities. The Sonography curriculum is 33 hours over 4 consecutive full-time semesters. After completion of the DMS program one must pass registry examinations in various specialized areas of ultrasound determined by one's area of employment. BRCC graduates are prepared to challenge the ARDMS registries in: Abdomen and OB/Gyn. Other specialties include: Vascular, Adult Cardiac, Pediatric Cardiac, Pediatric Neurosonology, Musculoskeletal and Breast

Technical Standards for Sonographers: Sonography can be physically and emotionally demanding. Sonographers are expected to work with machines which may weigh a few hundred pounds, and wheel the instruments through a hospital to the patient's bedside. You may also be required to assist with patient transfer from bed to wheelchair to exam table and back. Sonographers must be able to communicate effectively with distraught patients and family and with other health care givers. You must assess, with your primary health provider, if you can meet the physical and emotional demands of a sonography career. If you are pregnant or plan to become pregnant during the DMS program, you must meet these same requirements. If you cannot, your ability to complete the program in the allotted time may be affected.



- Communicate, read & write in English with proficiency to communicate with patients and other care givers and
 physicians
- 2. Assist patients in moving, turning, & transferring from transportation devices to exam tables
- 3. Be able to push, pull and lift 50 pounds and push ultrasound equipment on wheels
- 4. Maintain prolonged arm positions necessary for scanning
- 5. Be physically able to administer emergency patient care, including performing CPR
- 6. Be able to stand for long periods, and walk long distances (2 miles +/-) in a working day
